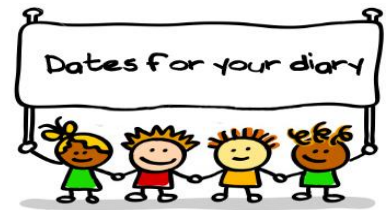


What can I say another fabulous week with only 13 children late this week.
