Beehive Lane Planned Footway

Resurfacing Work

We have received a letter from Ringway Jacobs which will affect the parking situation outside school over the next few months. Please read the information below so you are fully aware of the situation.

Thank-you.

Please be aware that Ringway Jacobs working in partnership with Essex County Council will be undertaking necessary footway maintenance work along Beehive Lane, Chelmsford. These works are planned to commence on Monday 17th October 2016 and will be in place until approximately mid-February. No works will be undertaken between 25th November and 3rd January to minimise disruption faced by residents in the run up to Christmas. Both footways from Baddow Road to B1007 Stock Road will have footway patching and localised kerbing works undertaken in preparation for surfacing treatment.

Please be advised that if kerbs are being replaced outside your property, it will not be possible for you to drive your vehicle across the footway to gain access to your driveway that evening, due to the time required for the concrete to set.

Whilst the contractors are working in the vicinity of your property, it will be necessary for this section to be free of vehicles and it would be of assistance if you could ensure your vehicle is moved prior to 8:00am each morning.
