

Dear Parent,

The new secondary school admission round opened on Wednesday 12th September 2018, for current Year 6 children to apply for a secondary school (Year 7) place for September 2019.

The statutory national closing date for applications is **31st October 2018**. **It is important that your application is received by that date.** This year no letters will be sent to parents, all applications need to be made online via www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. 98% of parents in Essex applied online last year.

The website also has a copy of the Secondary Education in Essex 2019-20 booklet which contains details of all secondary school and their admission policies.

Gate Access – for EYFS children

The gate for the Reception class is to be used **only** by Reception class parents.

This is an OFSTED requirement to safeguard the youngest children in school.

Year 1 come through their classroom door.
Year 2 to Year 6 must enter through the door by Year 6 in the morning

Our School Charging Policy

The Governing Body of Beehive Lane Primary School recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including outings, clubs and residential visits can make in enhancing and enriching the curriculum. In general, no charge is made where education is provided wholly or mainly during school hours that are part of the national curriculum. However, some activities would not be possible without the financial support of parents.

Voluntary Contributions

Whenever possible the relevant expenses are met from school resources but if this cannot be done, parents are invited to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of:

- Any activity which takes place during or outside school hours
- School equipment
- School funds generally

The pupils of parents who are unable or unwilling to contribute will not be discriminated against. Where there are not enough voluntary contributions to make the activity possible, and there is no way to make up the shortfall, then the activity must be cancelled. Sometimes the school pays additional costs in order to support the visit. Some visits are subsidised by funds from The Friends of Beehive School.
