Purpose and legal basis for processing your personal information

As part of this research project it may be necessary to process your personal information.

The legal basis we rely on to process your personal information is Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) where the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in Ofsted. This includes processing of personal data that is necessary for the exercise of a function conferred on Ofsted by an enactment and as a government department.

Under the Education and Inspections Act 2006, Ofsted is required to carry out its work in ways that encourage the services it inspects and regulates to improve, to be user-focused and to be efficient and effective in their use of resources.

In order to do this the Chief Inspector may do anything that she considers necessary or expedient for the purposes of, or in connection with, her functions including carrying out research.

Ofsted must consider any developments in approaches to inspection as part of its work and the outcomes from this research will feed into the design of the new education inspection framework 2019 which determines the manner in which inspections of services are carried out by inspectors.

We will not process sensitive information (defined as special category data in the GDPR) which reveals your racial or ethnic origin, political opinion, religious or philosophical beliefs or trade union membership, genetic, biometric or health data or data concerning your sex life or sexual orientation unless the condition in Article 9(2)(g) of the GDPR applies. This is where the processing is necessary for the exercise of a function of Ofsted and for reasons of substantial public interest.

What information will get from you?

- Information from pupil/ teacher discussions
- Information from lesson observations
- Details from workbooks – we will not record names but may take photographs of workbook pages and record observations of the workbooks

How do we get information?

Most of the personal information we process will be provided to us directly by you.

We may also receive personal information indirectly, in the following scenarios:

- *We have contacted your school about the research project and it gives us your personal information in its response.*
- *Your personal information is contained in reports given to us by your school.*

What we do with your information

We will only use the information for the purposes of the research to compile and prepare a report and we will not publish any identifying information.

We will not share your information with any third parties for the purposes of the research. No third parties will have access to your personal information unless the law allows.

How long we keep your personal information and how we decide this

We will keep information that is relevant to the research project for as long as this research project is active.

We may keep this information for a longer period of time, depending on whether any issues arise from the research.

We will minimise or anonymise data where possible and will not include any names. We will anonymise any personal information taken from workbooks and will not record pupils names from those workbooks.

What are your rights

You have the right to choose not to take part in a research project.

We are acting in the exercise of our official authority so you have the right to object to our processing of your personal information at any time. If you wish to object please contact Ofsted on Research_Surveys@ofsted.gov.uk. There may be legitimate reasons why we may refuse your objection, which will depend on why we are processing your information.
